
The health costs of violence

This report is a ground-breaking study that estimated the health impacts of intimate partner violence using burden of disease methodology. It found that intimate partner violence is the leading contributor to death, disability and illness in Victorian women aged 15–44 years. The study is widely used as evidence for urgent action on the problem.


Preventing violence before it occurs

This framework helps to shape Victorian policy and programming decisions over the next decade, including A Right to Respect: Victoria's plan to prevent violence against women 2010–2020, a statewide primary prevention policy – the first of its kind in the world.

Respect, Responsibility and Equality Phase I, 2007–2008

This first phase of VicHealth's programming stream in primary prevention sees 29 Victorian community-based partnerships each funded up to \$30,000 for 12 months, to pilot innovative projects in different settings or with diverse populations.

Media advocates project 2007 and 2014

An innovative project that sees women who have experienced violence trained and mentored as survivor advocates to speak publicly about their experiences.

VicHealth funds Women's Domestic Violence Crisis Service to develop the program.

Respect, Responsibility and Equality Phase II and III, 2008–2012

Five projects from Phase I are 'scaled up' for a further three years, with a view to consolidating promising practice in specific settings: local government, maternal and child health, corporate workplace, youth practitioner sector and faith. VicHealth's investment is \$1.8 million.


VicHealth brings project practitioners together for practice reflections and knowledge exchange through quarterly 'learning circles'. Evaluation reports, transferrable tools and resources are shared with the field.

A review of the literature on adult learning and violence prevention programs with men. The findings help to inform training initiatives of the Australian Football League's (AFL's) Respect and Responsibility program.

AFL Victoria: Fair game respect matters 2008–2014

A partnership with AFL Victoria to develop a program, tools and resources that community football clubs across three leagues can implement to build safe inclusive environments for women and girls. Total investment in this major initiative for the sports setting is \$1.4 million.

Participatory evaluation is employed to feed improvements to implementation in real time.

Preventing violence against women short course

A two-day course, developed for individuals and organisations involved in the work of primary prevention, is piloted and continuously improved. A three-hour Leadership for preventing violence against women workshop is subsequently designed.

Local government networking and capacity building project

A two-year initiative to engage 79 local councils so they can better foster safe and inclusive environments in which women and men can participate equally. A national conference in 2010 is one of the project's key achievements.

On project completion, the Municipal Association of Victoria (MAV) sustains some aspects of the project's work (e.g. a dedicated policy officer, statewide network, regular updates and tools).




More than ready

Partnership with Victorian Government: Department of Justice and Regulation

VicHealth contributes to the design of the Community Crime Prevention Unit's Reducing violence against women and their children grants program – funding 12 community partnerships in Victoria's metropolitan and rural regions for three-year prevention initiatives.

The partnership also sees VicHealth facilitate and evaluate four community of practice meetings for the funded projects over the first half of implementation.
