AWARDS FINALISTS CONFIRM VICTORIA AS LEADER IN HEALTH PROMOTION

More than 40 organisations from across the state are in the running for the top honours in the 2015 VicHealth Awards.

This year's finalists include advocacy groups, arts organisations, councils, health care providers, sporting bodies and universities.

VicHealth CEO Jerril Rechter said the standard of entries was inspiring and reaffirms Victoria as a world-leader in health promotion.

"We received an incredible spread of nominations across 10 categories this year, from projects making it easier for school students to access fresh fruit and vegetables, to new digital tools for preventing harm from alcohol, and the development of a choir that creates a sense of community and improved wellbeing.

"It's great to see so many organisations working with communities to help people to not only be free from disease, but live in a state of good physical and mental wellbeing," Ms Rechter said.

2015 also sees the return of a category to recognise the importance of journalism on health promotion issues.

"At VicHealth, we want to acknowledge the important role the media plays in health promotion. Well-informed and considered reporting on critical issues gets the attention of thousands of Victorians every day. From evening television news to weekly regional newspapers, there are reporters and media outlets across Victoria making a huge difference."

Finalists will join international and Victorian dignitaries in government and health promotion at the awards ceremony on **Tuesday 1 December**, where the winners will be announced.
