Stephen Walter is a senior corporate affairs professional with over 35 years' experience in corporate communications, stakeholder relations, marketing and business development gained through the public and private sectors. He was previously Chief of Staff at Australia Post where he also sat on the Executive Committee for a decade. He first joined the VicHealth Board in 2013.

VicHealth Chair Fiona McCormack said Ms Smith and Ms Watt, and the return of Mr Walter, would strengthen VicHealth's already diverse and passionate Board.
